We know that for many guests the huge variety of whiskies available can be daunting. To help those who want to try a selection of our range and learn more about the wonderful tastes and textures of this fabulous drink we have put together a selection which we hope you enjoy and will help you on your journey of discovery.

Speyside

Speyside, the undisputed center for whisky in Scotland, boasts the highest concentration of distilleries (more than half the distilleries in Scotland are located in Speyside). Although the Speyside region is geographically part of the Highlands, it is considered a separate region because of its unique characteristics. The region received its name from the river Spey, which cuts through the area. Many of the distilleries use water straight from the river Spey in their production process. Speyside scotch are thought to be the country's most complex, and is known for their sweetness and elegant flavors and aromas

Highland

The Highlands is the largest of the whisky producing regions in Scotland and generally produces more full-bodied whiskies with deeper notes of peat and smoke. Due to the vastity of the region, Highland whiskies often taste very different from each other, from the extreme heathery, spicy character of Northern Highlands to the fruity whiskies of the Southern Highlands.

Islands

In the world of Scotch whisky, "the Islands" refers to the whisky producing islands in the north and west of Scotland. These include the island of Mainland, the largest island in the Orkneys; the islands of Mull and Jura in the Inner Hebrides; Lewis in the Outer Hebrides; as well as the island of Arran, between the Campbeltown peninsula and the mainland, in the Firth of Clyde. The islands of Islay and Skye, also in the Inner Hebrides, are usually treated separately. Although diverse in flavours, peat and salinity are found in all of the Islands whiskies, because of the vicinity of the sea.

Lowland

There are only three operating distilleries remaining in the Lowlands. Lowlands is located at the southernmost part of Scotland and is a flat region with no mountains. Scotch from this region are generally considered as the most light bodied of the Single Malts.

Islay

Pronounced "eye-luh", Islay scotch is considered to be the smokiest and strongest-flavored (some say it tastes of the sea) of the single malts. Their strong flavor is believed to be due to the region's exposure to the high winds and seas of the west coast

Ireland

Irish whiskies are often thought to be smooth, fruity, and triple distilled, which many of them are, but this isn't the full story. Irish single pot still whiskey is a mix of barley, malted and otherwise, distilled in a pot still (and will be labelled as such).

And also... whiskies from **Japan** and the rest of the **world**, or **bourbon**

Speyside

Aberlour Sherry Cask 12Y

Sweet and well balanced with notes of sherry and spice, with aromas of honey, red apple and toffee, finished with hints of cinnamon and ginger.

Aultmore 12Y

Light sweet honey, sweet apples and fudge toffee, greenery and grapefruits, not as sweet as felt on the nose and just as we turn to the finish, oak wood spices. Overall it's light and delicate balanced by the heavy sweet apples notes.

Balvenie Double Wood 12Y

Medium and rich bodied, with a combination of mellow nutty and sweet flavours, plus orangey fruitiness and cinnamon spiciness.

Balvenie Triple Cask 12Y

The stunning combination of whisky from 3 very different casks. Oloroso sherry butts give it a subtle spicy back note, with the first fill bourbon barrels resulting in a vanilla sweetness that is typical of bourbon barrel whiskies.

Balvenie original cask finish

A perfect complement of light oatmeal syrupiness and brittle toffee are followed by delicate hints of spice and a rich drying sensation from European oak.

Benromach 10Y

Soft and mellow, with soft fruity notes, rich sherry influence and gentle peat smoke.

Crabbie 12Y

Sweet apple and juicy pears, citrus zest balanced by hints of nutmeg and cinnamon with bourbon-oaky vanilla throughout. Finish: Orchard fruits and vanilla continue for a well balanced, sweet and warming finish.

Cragganmore 12Y

A sherried 12 years old single malt from Diageo's Classic Malts range, this bottling from the Cragganmore distillery represents Speyside and proffers a rich, slightly floral whiskey with barley notes.

Glen Elgin 12Y

Soft and malty with some honey, lightly salted butter on toasted sultana loaf and hints of tiramisu. This soft whisky has a good length and a finish of barley and toasted oats.

Glenfiddich 15Y Distillery Edition

Matured in American and European oak casks. This single malt has concentrated floral flavours and intense, lingering spicy pepper aromas.

Glenfiddich Rich Oak 12Y

Firm bodied, creamy and smooth with plenty of vanilla alongside oak, with melon and apple.

Glenfiddich Vat 02

Deliciously smooth and silky. The sweetness of the spirit and spice of the Spanish oak combine to give a complex, intriguing flavour that evolves in the glass.

Glenfiddich Select Cask

With whiskies from select casks, they are finished in a Solera vat resulting in a rich single malt packed with orchard fruit, chewy caramels and cracked black pepper.

Glenlivet 12Y (Speyside)

Light to medium bodied, with a delicate balance of flowery, peachy and vanilla notes.

Glenlivet 12Y—Master's Distiller

Matured only in first fill American oak casks. Smooth and silky, with notes of creamy vanilla and coconut, plus sweet orange marmalade and hints of almonds.

Glenlivet 15Y

Rich and dreamy, with buttery notes, nutty flavours, and lingering trace of sweet almonds and hints of spice.

Glenlivet Caribbean reserve

Bold, smooth, rich caramel toffee notes, followed by flavours of tropical fruits

Glenlivet Nadurra 16Y

Smooth and well balanced with notes of sweet vanilla and rose petals, finished by a light spiciness of ginger and hazelnut.

Glenlivet Founder's Reserve

Smooth, medium bodied, with hints of honey, caramel, vanilla and marzipan, plus toasted almonds on the finish.

Glenrothes Manse Reserve

Full bodied combination of ripe fruits, juicy citrus, creamy vanilla and complex spices.

Glenrothes Select Reserve

Full bodied combination for a sweet, clear and fruity spirit.

Glenrothes Robur Reserve

Aromas of dried fruit to start slowly mellows to a sweet and spicy lasting finish.

Glenrothes Vintage Reserve

Red berries and nutty, with a light fruit cake feel to it. The finish is long lasting with honey and lemon flavours emerging.

Monkey Shoulder

Smooth with lingering sweetness and rich vanilla flavour, plus taste of brown sugar, creamy toffee and a hint of spicy cinnamon and nutmeg.

Tomintoul Peated

There is pronounced aroma of camphor along with recently fallen leaves. There is an oily character to the whisky with the finish bringing more smoke.

Highlands

Aberfeldy 12Y

Light bodied, slightly spicy with clean fruit notes of tangerines and kumquats, with a hint of smokiness

Ancnoc Black Hill Reserve

Apple and orange stay at the fore, backed up by continued bourbon-cask vanillas and a touch of spice.

Ardmore Peated

Full bodied, which is both robust and sweet with fruity hints in the background.

Balblair 2004 1st Release

Quite nutty and sweet, though creamy vanilla and oak keep it grounded.

Clynelish 14Y

Firm and smoky bodied, with cleansing flavours of coriander, orange and spices.

Dalmore 12Y

Smooth bodied, with sweet vanilla fudge like flavour plus delicate citrus, sherry and ginger notes.

Dalmore Valour

Chocolatey, with treacle and malt loaf, a touch of nutmeg and a long warm finish with orange aromas and cinnamon.

Dalwhinnie 15Y H

A great single malt Scotch whisky, and excellent value for money too. The flavours are simple, but flawless, a clean, crisp 15 year old from the Dalwhinnie Distillery

Fettercairn Fier

Aromas of crushed pear and toffee apple with taste notes of bold dark chocolate, roasted coffee beans and peat smoke fused with nutmeg, mint, citrus fruit and truffle

Fettercairn 12y

A revitalised Fettercairn, focusing on the distillery's fruity character. Tropical flavour with gentle gingery spice.

Glen Deveron 16Y

Chewy cereal notes and green apple, soon joined by an elegant, subtle hint of peat smoke. A lasting warm finish.

Glendronach 12Y

Medium bodied, rich, creamy and silky-smooth, with warm, rich oak and sherry sweetness, plus tones of raisins and soft fruits.

Glen Garioch Founders Reserve

Spices and a sweet and juicy pear finish conclude a fruit laden mouth-watering taste complete with Glen Garioch's trademark creamy texture.

Glenmorangie Original

The 'original' sets a high standard for Highland whisky, and has gone from strength to strength since its slightly controversial packaging redesign a few years ago. Medium-bodied and gently warming, with pleasant spicy notes.

Glen Turner Double Cask

Apple again and some other fruits, maltiness. Woody notes, some alcohol sharpness shows from the back.

Loch Lomond 12Y, Inchmoan

Deep fruity character of peach and pear layered with a vanilla sweetness with hints of gentle wood smoke and a lingering peaty tang.

Lochlomond 10Y, Inchmoan,

Born from a combination of malt whiskies from our traditional swan neck pot still and our unique straight neck pot still to create an unconventional peat character with a lot of depth marrying smoke and spiciness

Mackinlay's Shackleton Blended Malt

Inspired by the whisky left behind by Antarctica by Sir Ernest Shackleton in the early 1900s and discovered frozen but intact over 100 years later. Juicy apple and orange, with contained honey richness.

Old Pulteney Dunnet Head

Punchy, oily, nutty, subtle sweetness, more red fruits, raisins, little leathery, spices.

Oban Little Bay

Fancy chocolates with the flakes of sea salt, pound cake topped with demerara sugar and cinnamon. Citrus returns on the mid-palate.

Royal Brackla, Cowdor Estate

Named the Kings's Own Whiskey, a 2015 release as part of the Last Great Malts series, Royal Brackla 12 Year Old is finished in first-fill Oloroso sherry casks and is light and spicy with notes of vanilla and black pepper.

Royal Lochnagar 12Y

Smooth with a slight sweetness, herbal with a touch of honey and heather, and a light vanilla finish. First distillery visited and would definitely recommend.

Speyburn Single Malt

Wonderfully balanced, with notes of green apples, honey, lemon and floral vanilla.

Strathisla 12Y

Medium bodied, with fruity and sherry notes, and teasing sweet-and-dry character.

Tullibardine 225 Sauternes

Fresh and fruity on the nose, with cantaloupe, lemon zest, and orange marmalade existing beside cocoa, honey, and tropical fruit. On the palate, there's white chocolate, orange bitters, oak spice, black pepper, vanilla and even a little grape.

Islands

Arran 10Y (Isle of Arran)

Full bodied, Sweet . Quite malty, followed by green fruits and apple peel.

Jura 10 Years

A well-balanced entry in the Jura range, made up of both smoky and unpeated whisky matured in bourbon casks and finished in sherry, adding darker notes to the soft smoke and fresh fruit of the distillery's whisky.

Jura Superstition (Isle of Jura)

Light bodied, with sweetish notes, plus earthy and salty finish.

Jura the Sound (Isle of Jura)

Nutty, tangy nose, you can smell dry fruits, vanilla, toffee and under ripe fruit. On the palate, you will find grape like notes, rich, bittersweet balance as both coffee beans and chocolate mix with toffee ad fruit.

Jura Rum cask finish (Isle of Jura)

This mouth-wateringly smooth, yet vibrant whisky delivers flavours of sweet vanilla, fudge, coconut and spiced tropical notes.

Ledaig (Isle of Mull)

Tantalisingly sweet with sparks of spicy pepper, peaty smoke and vanilla malty creaminess, plus vibrant liquorice, cloves and saltiness on the finish.

Talisker Dark Storm (Isle of Skye)

Huge oak influence, with a burst of smoke on palate entry. Beyond that though, you find red fruits, citrus and honey.

Talisker 10Y (Isle of Skye)

Intense, full bodied with huge plumes of smoke and volcanic, peppery peat.

Talisker Skye

This expression brings with it a more well-rounded and sweet flavour profile packed with fresh citrus, sweet smoke, peppery spice and traditional Talisker maritime notes. Perfect for those who perhaps find the classic Talisker flavour profile a bit too much, not to say that Talisker fans won't enjoy it too.

Tobermory 10Y (Isle of Mull)

A gentle, affable malt. Quite sweet and light with tastes of honey and soft oak, the smoke and peppers rise gently with a touch of dried fruit and peel with a cinnamon note.

Lowlands

Auchentoshan American Oak

Bounty bars, more citrus peels and peaches. A little bit buttery, with golden barley and oak spice developing on the mid palate.

Auchentoshan Blood Oak

Matured in casks that once held fine red wine and then into American bourbon casks this unique whisky is a ruby gold colour with tastes of blood orange, nutmeg and ginger. It has a beautiful lingering oak spice to the end.

Auchentoshan Heartwood

Nuttier than the nose, a core of hazelnut and almond, surrounded by chocolate buttons, apple and fresh ground coffee, with a finish of dried fruit and citrus.

Auchentoshan Select

Light bodied, with notes of lemongrass, toasty maltiness and sweet and spicy finish.

Auchentoshan Springwood

A nutty, citrusy subtle malt with a zesty twist of pink grapefruit.

Auchentoshan 12Y

Elegant and refined, with those Auchentoshan notes of vanilla.

Girvan Patent Still

Lots of vanilla, boiled sweets, foam bananas, with a hint of honey. Sweet, peppery and light finish

Glenkinchie 12Y

Light bodied, with delicate notes of walnuts and almonds, and a whiff of wild flowers.

Haig Club

Apple crumble, expressed lemon and a touch of mango. With a hint of honeycomb. Supporting notes of oak and tropical fruit.

Islay

Bowmore 12Y

Beautiful coastal notes with a gentle peat, it is the balance that the floral element presents that makes this a great entry bottling for Bowmore.

Bunnahabhain Eirigh Na Greine

Lively and satisfyingly smooth. Fusion of cherries, prunes, apricots with subtle hints of rich cocoa and spicy oakness.

Bunnahabhain Stiùreadair

Pays homage to the distillery's shoreline on the north-east coast of Islay. They used whisky matured in first and second fill Sherry casks, with a leaning towards deliciously coastal malt. Honey-roasted nuts, cinnamon and clove, with a touch of salt sea too.

Bruichladdich, Port Charlotte

Orange, sherbet and vanilla bring sweetness to the earthy peat. With hints of lavender and heather

Bruichladdich, The Classic Laddie

Smooth as pebbles in a pool. It's clean, fresh and lively with both the oak and the grain in perfect harmony.

Kilchoman Single Malt

Malty sweetness followed by soft peaty wood smoke aromas, mixed fruit and spices.

Lagavulin 10Y

Sweet and salty, with a good kick of chilli pepper, followed by roasted almond and more smoke. Finish: A creamy, smoky, spicy finish.

Lagavulin 16Y

Very thick and rich. A massive mouthful of malt and Sherry with good fruity sweetness, but also a wonderful sweetness. Big, powerful peat and oak.

Laphroaig 10Y

Really smoky and iodine rich. This has to be one of Scotland's most characterful drams. Laphroaig are known for their medicinal malts, and the classic 10 year old is no exception.

Laphroaig Four Oak

Matured in four different types of cask: ex-bourbon barrels, small quarter casks, virgin American oak barrels and European oak hogsheads. Hints of sandalwood, pine, fir and willow, experience oak embers and seaweed with smooth buttercream.

Ireland

Bushmills Irish Malt 10Y (N. Ireland)

Light bodied, with flavours of baked pears, green apples, fleur de sel caramels and vanilla fudge notes all make appearances on the palate.

Bushmills Black Bush

This Irish whiskey features a lot of sherried malt in its recipe, alongside classically caramelly grain whisky.

Connemara (Dublin)

A distinctly intense peat smoke character mingling with a fresh coastal breeze, this ruggedness is offset by a delicious vanilla sweetness.

Greenore 8Y (Dublin)

Made from corn and matured in ex-bourbon American oak barrels for over 8 years giving it a silky smooth sweet taste with rich vanilla tones.

Kilbeggan 8Y (Kilbeggan)

Sweet, smooth vanilla before spicy oak comes in. A long finish with hints of maple and pecan.

Locke's 8Y (Kilbeggan)

The barley is big and succulent with a copper tanginess followed by a dry fruity flavour.

Powers Distiller's cut

A marvellous expression packing waves of cooked apple, honeycomb and spicy malt notes.

Redbreast (Cork)

Full flavoured and complex: A harmonious balance of spicy, creamy, fruity, sherry and toasted notes.

Slane Triple Casked (Slane)

Smooth, complex and robust. Sweet and rather fresh with pastries, buttery vanilla, sweet spices and floral notes. The palate is a burnt caramel, honey and bay leaf with more spices coming though on the finish.

Teeling Single Malt (Dublin)

A selection of five wine-cask finished whiskey were used for this release, including Sherry, Port, Madeira, white Burgundy, and Cabernet Sauvignon.

Teeling Single Grain (Dublin)

Honeyed apple flesh and red grape, sweet and slightly floral with fragrant vanilla and spice, evaporated milk and brown sugar. This is a thoroughly enjoyable grain whiskey, sweet and fairly light but full of flavour.

Tullamore Dew – Caribbean Cask (Tullamore)

Original triple distilled triple blend of pot still, malt, and grain. Finished with the finest first fill XO rum casks to deliver sweet tropical flavours.

Tullamore Dew Tripe Distilled

Restrained apple & blackcurrant leafy nose. Lovely silky palate. Soft and spicy finish.

Tyrconnell Malt (Dublin)

Medium bodied, with a tang of oranges and lemons, a strong malt presence that balances well with the oily sweetness.

Japan

Akashi

Buttered hot cross buns, lemon grass and a light hint of spicy grain with a sweet apricot finish.

Kirin Fuji Sanroku

Cheery and almond cake peated smoke and thyme with a caramel sweetness.

Nikka Taketsuru

An aroma of caramelised apple and peach with notes of apple crumble and salted butter caramel.

Nikka Coffee Grain

Sweet fruity flavour of melon and grapefruit balanced by a crunchy biscuit and vanilla with a sweet and vibrant finish.

Suntory Toki blended

Soft orchard fruits and thyme honey are joined by peppermint in the backdrop with a white pepper and ginger finish.

The Chita

Vanilla sponge cake with hints of honey. A touch of orchard blossom make this a perfect whiskey for the summer months.

Togouchi

Rather peaty with spicy notes of oak running through it.

Tokinoka

Honey'd cereal, green apple and sultanas. Flavours of White chocolate and maple syrup with a peppercorn finish.

Bourbon

1792 (Kentucky, USA)

Buttery warmth up front, followed by black pepper and Sesame Snaps. Soft smoky hints of charred oak and cinnamon

Buffalo trace (Kentucky, USA)

Brown sugar, toffee apple, sweet oak, custard, oily espresso beans, a touch of chocolate-covered raisins and toasty wood.

Bulleit Bourbon (Kentucky, USA)

Orange zest notes, followed by some warming winter spices and a hint of tobacco with a smooth and spicy finish.

Bulleit Rye (Kentucky, USA)

Rather hot at first, the spices coming from the forefront. This is followed by peaches and cherries, with the spice returning in the finish.

Copper Fox Single Malt (Virginia USA)

A great whiskey for whiskey lovers with a sweet tooth. This non smoked whiskey has matured in a selection of the finest small and big casks. A smooth and complex whiskey that caresses the palate with notes of chocolate and dried fruits

Gentleman Jack (Tennessee, USA)

Charcoal mellowed twice, before and after aging, this results in a cleaner more refined version of this American classic. With a palate of sweet vanilla, stone fruits and apple, the finish is subtle oak that develops into a smooth fruitiness of maple and floral honey.

Knob Creek (Kentucky, USA)

A classic bourbon from Jim Beam, named after the creek which flows near where Abraham Lincoln grew up. Peppy and full, with notes of candy floss and nut oil, a touch of spice and dark chocolate and a little spice and charred oak.

Woodford Reserve Double oak (Kentucky, USA)

Triple distilled with a high percentage of rye this is a must have Kentucky bourbon. A thick and full palate has notes of espresso beans, winter spice, plenty of rye and some ginger and rum, which ends with a long and mature finish

Wild Turkey 101 (Kentucky, USA)

Beautiful concentration, with waves of spicy cinnamon, clove and nutmeg, toasted hazelnuts and a faint, fresh, minty note..

Rest of the World

Aberfalls (Wales)

Sherry notes with dried fruit and spice, complemented by forest fruit flavours, creamy malt, nuts, dark chocolate and espresso.

Amrut Fusion (Bangalore, India)

Heavy, thickly oaked and complex: some barley sugar notes shrouded in soft smoke. Big, but seductively gentle too.

Amrut Single Malt (Bangalore, India)

Distinctly confident liquorice-bourbon notes with a near perfect bitter-sweet balance; burnt honeycomb and toffee also abound.

Armorik, Wrenghem (France)

Using whiskies aged in refill bourbon casks, they produce a rich, malty whisky, which has a touch of coastal air in its profile.

Bains Cape Whisky (Wellington, South Africa)

The first single grain whisky from South Africa. Warm and smooth with distinctive toffee and caramel notes. Great with chocolates and deserts.

Chapter 6 (Norfolk, England)

The first widely available English whisky, distilled from locally grown barley in Norfolk. Interesting and challenging (for the Scots!).

Danica Whiskey (Denmark)

A great whiskey for whiskey lovers with a sweet tooth. This non smoked whiskey has matured in a selection of the finest small and big casks.

Eddu Silver Broceliande (France)

This whiskey is made exclusively with buckwheat and has notes of vanilla and mixed spices which are both fragrant and nutty. Breton whiskey.

Eddu Grey Rock (France)

Peppery, perfumed apples and vanilla custard with some soothing wheat but still quite feisty.

Gibson's 12Y (Quebec, Canada)

Medium bodied, with pronounced notes of vanilla, warm oak and a hint of almond.

Kavalan (Northern Taiwan)

A well balanced natural sweetness of vanilla and oak spices, with a round and complex smoothness.

Hellyers Road (Tasmania, Australia)

Aged in American oak, this single malt embodies citrus tones of orange and lemon. While a vanilla sweetness transcends the palate

Lothaire (France)

This golden, amber Single Malt shows notes of white fruits, toasted hazelnuts and warm cereal. It is rich and round, with suppleness and great length on the finish. Aged in ex-Bourbon and ex-French spirit (Cognac, Armagnac) barrels and new Lorraine oak barrels

Mackmyra (Gävle, Sweden)

Light bodied, with spicy aromas of roasted Swedish oak and a fruity, elegant flavour with hints of citrus, caramel and vanilla.

Mackmyra Brukswhiskey (Gävle, Sweden)

Vanilla cream, custard and fruit to start, followed with red berries, boiled sweets and a rich warming bourbon.

Manx Malt (Isle of Man)

A spirit that captures the complex tastes of the matured single malt whisky, but in a liquid that is crystal clear. Interesting to try once!

Paul John Brilliance (Goa, India)

Lots of chewy caramel and chocolate here. Picks up from lively spice along the way, with a little bit of waxy orange peel on the mid palate.

Paul John Edited (Goa, India)

Honey and cocoa laced with a hint of smokiness and a shot of espresso. With notes of barley gently making way for a subtle peat followed by hints of chocolate mint and spice.

Penderyn Madeira (Penderyn, Wales)

Medium bodied, with notes of vanilla, green apples and refreshing citrus, with smoke and vanilla lingering on the attractive medium length finish.

Rampur (India)

Thyme honey, dried apricot, cinnamon and vanilla with a long drying finish.

Roc' Elf (France)

Distilled in Dinan, Brittany. Aged for 5 to 6 years in oak barrels from Coteau du Layon, finished in beer barrels from the same distillery – *Brasserie Sainte Colombe*.

Slyrs Bavarian Single Malt (Germany)

A mild malty taste with fruity aromas with a long and intense spicy finish with light smoke aromas of the toasted barrel. The 2015 World Whiskey Awards winner of "Best European Single Malt 12 years and under".

Starward Two Fold (Australia)

Soft vanilla fudge, coffee and walnut cake, summer berries and stewed stone fruit.

Tácnbor, Ad Gefrein (Northumberland England)

On the nose, notes of honey, vanilla, candied citrus peel and spices are backed up on the palate with the flavours of sultanas, cream soda and nutmeg. The finish lingers and coats the mouth with the tastes of honey, vanilla and sweet citrus.

Three Ships Bourbon Cask (Wellington, South Africa)

First released in 2005 this blended whisky of 100% South African whisky is finished in Bourbon casks to give a soft honeyed sweetness with vanilla notes and subtle hints of pepper and spice.
